## Cohen Veterans Network Quick Summary

The Cohen Veterans Network publicly launched in April 2016. Steven A. Cohen Military Family clinics then opened in San Antonio (May), Dallas (June), Los Angeles (October) and Philadelphia (October). These clinics joined New York to complete a group of five pilot clinics.

By this summer, the network will expand to El Paso, Texas, Washington D.C. and Fayetteville, North Carolina. Four more clinic openings are planned by the end of 2017, including Denver and Killeen, Texas.

Current results:

- CVN clinics treated **more than 2,500 clients** across the country from 2016 through April 2017.
- Among all of our clients, women represent 40% of the population. Among just veteran clients, women make up 25% of the group.

The approximate breakdown of the client outpatient population at the four new clinics:

- 65% veterans
- 25% adult family members (non-veterans)
- 10% children

Key takeaways:

- CVN is treating the **entire military family** as 35% of our clients are non-veterans.
- Most our clients (80%) have experienced first appointments **within one week** after contacting our clinics.
- CVN is **seeing veterans** who have served in the United States Armed Forces, regardless of role while in uniform or discharge status. This includes the National Guard and Reserves.
- We are treating parents, siblings, spouses or partners, children, caretakers, and others.
