Cohen Veterans Network Quick Summary

The Cohen Veterans Network publicly launched in April 2016. Steven A. Cohen Military Family clinics opened in San Antonio (May), Dallas (June), Los Angeles (October) and Philadelphia (October). These clinics joined New York to complete a group of five pilot clinics.

The network has recently expanded to Fayetteville, North Carolina and El Paso, Texas. At least four more clinic openings are planned by the end of 2017: Washington D.C., Denver, Colorado, Killeen, Texas and Clarksville, Tennessee.

Current results:

- CVN clinics have treated **more than 3,400 clients** across the country from 2016 to date.

Key takeaways:

- CVN is treating the **entire military family** as 38% of our clients are non-veterans.
- Most our clients (75%) have experienced first appointments **within one week** after contacting our clinics.
- Among all of our clients, women represent 40% of the population. Among just veteran clients, **women make up 23%** of the group. This percentage is two times the size of the female veteran population in the United States.
- CVN is **seeing veterans** who have served in the United States Armed Forces, regardless of role while in uniform or discharge status. This includes the National Guard and Reserves.
- We are treating parents, siblings, spouses or partners, children, caretakers, and others.
