Cohen Veterans Network to Open its First Clinic in Georgia for Veterans, Active Duty, and Their Families

A new Cohen Clinic offering accessible, high-quality mental health care will open near Fort Stewart in 2022

Stamford, CT., July 26 2021 – In another step toward meeting the \$275M commitment set forth by financier-philanthropist Steven A. Cohen to help reduce veteran suicide and increase care for military families, the nonprofit [Cohen Veterans Network](#) (CVN) has committed to opening a clinic in Hinesville, GA early next year. The first of its kind in the state of Georgia.

More than 16,000 post-9/11 veterans and 19,000 active duty service members, as well as 26,000 of their family members, will be eligible for care at The Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic located at 345 West Memorial Drive in Hinesville.

“We are thrilled to go into an area of critical need in Hinesville. I’ve spent time at Fort Stewart and know first-hand that our model of care is a perfect fit for this location and community,” said Dr. Anthony Hassan, President & CEO of CVN. “We understand the options for care for veterans and those still serving – as well as their families – are limited in this market and we are here to help fill those gaps.”

In addition to providing care to those within reach of the Hinesville location, the Cohen Clinic will offer telehealth services statewide to more than 300,000 post-9/11 veterans, active duty, and family members across the state. [CVN Telehealth](#) – face-to-face video therapy – allows clients to receive treatment from the privacy and comfort of their own home.

The 5,000 square-foot Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic will begin serving clients in early 2022. The clinic will soon hire a Clinic Director, several clinicians, and other integral roles including Outreach, Case Management, and Intake. CVN will announce a local operating partner for the clinic in the coming months.

CVN offers brief, client-centered therapy for a variety of mental health issues including depression, anxiety, post-traumatic stress, adjustment issues, anger, grief and loss, family issues, transition challenges, relationship problems, and children’s behavioral problems. Since its inception in April 2016, CVN has built 19 Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinics across the country and has treated nearly 25,000 clients. The network plans to open an additional four clinics within the year.
