## **Cohen Veterans Network Launches Colorado Springs Mental Health Clinic for Veterans, Service Members and Their Families**

### *CVN Provides Accessible, High-Quality Care Across the State of Colorado via CVN Telehealth*

Stamford, CT., November 7, 2022 – Today, [Cohen Veterans Network](#) (CVN), a national not-for-profit network of mental health clinics for post-9/11 veterans, service members and their families, announced the launch of a new Cohen Clinic in Colorado Springs, CO. The Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic at Red Rock is now treating clients virtually via [CVN Telehealth](#), face-to-face video therapy, with a physical location set to open later this fall for in-person appointments.

This comes as CVN evolves its operations in Colorado having served more than 1,000 clients at the Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinic in Greenwood Village, CO since 2018. After four years, CVN and the University of Colorado Department of Psychiatry, mutually decided not to extend their operating agreement related to the clinic in Greenwood Village. Veterans, service members and military families in the Denver area and across Colorado can continue to receive treatment through the new Colorado Springs Cohen Clinic.

“CVN Telehealth is a game changer. It allows CVN to transition locations seamlessly and provides clients across the state of Colorado an opportunity to receive critical mental health services,” said Dr. Anthony Hassan CVN President and CEO. “As our operations evolve, we look forward to building on our established presence and remain deeply committed to providing accessible, high-quality care to the veteran and military community in Colorado.”

“We have greatly appreciated our partnership with Cohen Veterans Network, which enabled us to provide outstanding care to veterans, service members, and their families since opening in 2018,” said Dr. Neill Epperson Chair of University of Colorado Department of Psychiatry. “We remain resolute in our commitment to serving this important population and continue to provide evidence-based and accessible care through a clinic within the Department. Cohen Veterans Network is providing a critical service and we wish everyone in the Network success.”

The new Cohen Clinic in Colorado Springs is in partnership with Red Rock Behavioral Health, which also operates the Cohen Clinic at Red Rock Behavioral Health in Lawton, OK.

Since its inception in April 2016, CVN has treated more than 45,000 clients. There are currently 22 Steven A. Cohen Military Family Clinics across the country with a total of 25 clinics set to be open by the end of 2022.
